NEW VICTA IN THE FAR NORTH

On a cold, windy, drizzly Tableland day I sat down to clear the accumulated unattended emails when boredom suddenly set in. As you do in these circumstances, I digressed to a little web surfing of the aeroplane sales and after dreaming of the ones I knew I couldn't afford, up



pops a Victa Airtourer for a price that got my attention. Following diligent research and a fresh annual it was off to Bendigo with my youngest daughter to bring the Victa home.

I'd flown a Victa back in the 80's at Redcliffe and liked the way they flew. They are aerobatic, designed and made in Australia, had 'Rolls Royce' on the rocker covers, didn't need 2 stroke oil, and burns 21 l/h. A bit different to the 60l/h l'd been used to in the Cherokee.

Having done most of my flying in Queensland and a trip to Broome I knew we lived in an expansive country, so when we took off from Bendigo we were in NSW after flying all of 40nm. (Atherton to Pinnarendi for coffee and pizza is 60nm each way).

Leaving Bendigo mid-morning we headed for Cobar to refuel then on to Charleville to arrive 30 minutes before last light with a Mooney, the RFDS and us with the same circuit time. They showed respect and called themselves number 2 and 3.

The pilot of the Mooney offered us a lift into town, such is the country hospitality.

Off to the RSL for a good feed and a quiet one, then back to the motel for an earlyish night.

Early start the next day with clear skies refuelling at Barcaldine then Hughenden landing at Atherton to a family welcome.

The next part of the process of acquiring a Victa was joining the Airtourer Association and the Co-operative. It soon became evident how passionate fellow owners are in flying them and preserving their place on the Register. By being members of the Co-operative owners have access to guidance and spare parts.

It has been an interesting journey researching the history of its design, development, manufacture, sale to New Zealand and then having the RAAF purchasing the CT4 as a trainer from NZ. Prior to the sale to New Zealand, Victa had made 168 aircraft. Made in 1964, my Victa is number 67.

THE VICTA AIRTOURER STORY

The Airtourer was the winning design, submitted by Henry Millicer, the chief aerodynamicist of Australia's Government Aircraft Factories, in a competition organised by Britain's Royal Aero Club in 1953. A wooden prototype was constructed by a small group of enthusiasts (the Air Tourer Group of the Australian Ultra Light Aircraft Association) in the Melbourne suburb of Williamstown during the late 1950s. This prototype, registered *VH-FMM* was first flown on 31 March 1959 by Flt. Lt. Randell Green at Moorabbin airport.


The Victa aircraft company purchased *VH-FMM* from the AULAA in an exchange deal where the aircraft was swapped for a new Piper Tri-Pacer.




