SUNDAY THE 18th February 2024

The AAC clubhouse at Atherton Aerodrome is in need of a little tidy up. A working bee will take place in conjunction with our regular monthly Meeting & BBQ Lunch on the 18th February. Usual starting time of our meeting is 10:30 am however, a bit earlier from say 9:30 would get things done earlier.

SMOKE IS NO JOKE - (SMOKE HAZARDS)

This recent Flightsafety Australia article (link below) is a timely reminder of the hazards associated with VFR flight in smoky conditions.

We in Australia are no strangers to the destructive effect of bushfires however the difficulties of VFR flight in even light smoke pollution can come as a real surprise when encountered for the first time. The lack of a defined horizon can be quite disconcerting even when in-flight visibility is well in excess of the minimum.

The dry south-easterly season in Northern Australia can see uncontrolled bushfires start on the eastern side of Cape York and over several months burn right across to the Gulf of Carpenteria producing wide spread areas of smoke sometimes with layers up to 8000 feet.

The glare off smoke haze makes it virtually impossible to see opposite direction traffic when flying into the sun, especially in the early morning or late afternoon. So much for "See and be Seen" - Hold your breath and hope that traffic flying down sun are keeping a *really* good lookout! - Or, plan to avoid those situations and time of day.



Extracts from the FNQAM Feb 2024 News

Hi All.

The following is a summary of 2024 to date plus some pictures and a new concept video below.

We reopened our doors on January 10th and were thrilled to welcome visitors from across the globe, including guests from America, as well as domestic visitors and attendees of the Cairns Aviation Careers Day. Surpassing our expectations, we've seen more visitors than expected for this time of year.

We've recently acquired a 6-metre storage container, providing essential storage space for new donations and parts. Thanks to FGF for generously allowing us to utilise their space while we loaded Stephen Fowler's recently donated collection. This new addition will liberate space in our main restoration area, paving the way for upcoming projects.

In other developments, we're in the process of re-securing public liability insurance for Dakota access with the national museum's insurance broker. After our proactiveness to advise of new, safer stairs, our current insurer was taken aback by the presence of aircraft at an aviation museum—quite an unexpected revelation! Unfortunately, until this matter is resolved, we are unable to offer young visitors tours inside the Dakota and will be limited to volunteers only, so become a volunteer!

Research: Joan has been making great progress with our locally based WWII personnel finding more and more records, Ian has been focused on local B-17 operations and Alan has been successfully forging links with US groups such as the 43rd Bombardment Group.

Looking ahead, we have an exciting lineup of projects awaiting final funding or approval, including virtual reality flight experiences, a flight simulator project, LEGO STEM Science Week, and immersive displays for accessible tourism (see the impressive video below). Our displays stands and signage are also in the process of being upgraded.

Finally, we're in urgent need of engineers to lead and mentor our students and volunteers to help our projects move forward. If you know any LAMEs who may be interested in contributing, even once a month on a Thursday, Friday, or Saturday, please don't hesitate to reach out!


Aircraft Models:



Those seeking the issue or renewal of an Aviation Security Identification Card (ASIC) should apply directly to **Aviation ID Australia** via the following link:






