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MORE FLIGHT PLANNING SOFTWARE—By Bill Gronbeck

<u>AirNav VFR</u>—Following on from my previous article about software for Android devices I continued to scout around for other useful flight planning software. The latest program that I have evaluated is AirNav VFR. The trial version I downloaded does not have all the bells and whistles of the full version but enough to make a good assessment of the programs capabilities.

After building several flight plans and working through the map printing options I have decided that this is the program that most suits my own individual requirements.

The most useful feature, for those who do not possess an iPad or an Android tablet, is the ability to plan using digitized current copies of Airservices WAC, VNC, VTC etc charts and then to print out the area covering the planned route. Weather and Notams can be downloaded from NAIPS and if required a flight plan submitted in the approved format. The flight plan can also be uploaded from your PC or Laptop to your GPS thus saving much duplication of effort.

iPad and iPhone users are not left out in the cold as there is also a feature for uploading the flight plan onto those platforms.


Pictured below is a simple flight plan constructed using the Melbourne VNC. The smaller window is the Checklist tool used during the process.



When flight planning has been finalized the route can be printed out on A4 sheets with a suitable overlap (e.g. three sheets required to cover this route). We then have a set of *legal* hard copy maps to use during our flight.

When planning, maps may be zoomed as required to enable easier reading of fine detail. The following picture of a short flight in a relatively congested area is an example of that feature.

A basic subscription comes with charts for one area (e.g. all of Queensland), additional chart areas may be purchased for around \$30 per region. It should be noted that charts will become unusable after their expiry date. (This requirement has been imposed by Airservices Australia to prevent the use of out-of-date charts when flight planning).

So we now have software programs available to suit just about any user preference and/or combination of PC, Laptop, iPad, iPhone & Android Tablet/Phone that a person might have. I won't say that any one particular program is the best, they all have their pluses and minuses. Best check out the following links (in no particular order) and make up your own mind.

EASTER FLY-IN STARKE AIRFIELD


The following is an invitation to a fly-in at Starke Airfield outside of Townsville:


Navigation Refresher WORKSHOP—By Bill Gronbeck


Apologies again for the delay in getting the workshop going. I have a little free time at last and will contact those who previously expressed an interest in attending.
