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
BUILDERS CORNER - Extracts from Jon Collins' Skybolt Blog


December 6th - Brake system is now almost complete. Took a while to decide on the method and materials but I am happy with the result. Used high pressure NSR nylon brake tubing for flexibility and maintenance. Connected with SAE brass fittings.

Also learning how to use the HVLP spray gun! Undercoated the fuselage stringers (the ribs of the rear fuselage!) and

undercoated the windscreen fibreglass then top coated the stringers. The spray gun is great to work with and gives an excellent result.











OCTOBER SAFETY CHAT

This month we are looking at non-controlled serodrome circuit procedures and the safest way to join ini

Marcebe is a very busy non-controlled aerodrome. It can get crowded at times with circuit treffic, local flights, commercial operations, IPE aircraft using the RNAV, ag ops and search and rescue treffic possing through the areal

A non-controlled serodrome will have an active runway and an active side, the standard circuit is always a left hand circuit unless otherwise specified. If you look up Mareebe's entry in the ERSA you will see that on Runway 28 the circuit pattern is always to the right, so in Mareebe the active side of the runway will always be to the north regardless of which runway is in use.




So, you are arriving at Marache to find it flat out. What's the best way to join the circuit, keep yourself clear of traffic and make sure you don't out anyons off or become a safety hazard?

CASA has a number of different safety posters, handouts and publications that go into detail on the recommended way to join a busy circuit.

When arriving at an unfamiliar serodrome or where the wind is unknown the the overfly technique is the recommended procedure. This means joining the circuit usually 2000ft above serodrome height, allowing you to assess the situation and then descend on the non-active side to join the circuit crosswind (or midfield) when clear of traffic.

If you are arriving on the active side of the circuit you should arrive at circuit height and join a midfield downwind at approx 45%. You can also join the circuit onto base, this is not a standard procedure, you must first have datarmined wind speed, active runway, give way to other circuit traffic and broadcast your intentions.



The straight in approach, while popular is not a recommanded standard procedure. You can make a straight in approach if you meet certain criteria; when it will not disrupt the flow of circuit traffic, you must give way to aircraft aiready established in the circuit, you should have determined the wind and runway in use, you must be established on final not less than Snm from the threshold, you must broadcast your intention to do a straight in approach.

Some other things to remember!

It is the pilots responsibility to use "See and Avoid" techniques to maintain separation, you can read about this in CAAP 166-2(1). Remember do not descend into the active side of a circuit from above, make sure you are already at circuit height because of difficulties seeing and being seen by any aircraft directly below you. CAAP 166-01 is another handy resource with information about Operations in the vicinity of non-controlled aerodromes.



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
