NEW GYRO AIRCRAFT ON THE LOCAL SCENE

Local flyer Nat Jaques, who already owns two Magni gyrocopters, recently took delivery of a bigger, more powerful machine. The *Titanium Explorer* was designed and built in Canberra, NSW. Nat had the opportunity to get to know the finer points of the new machine during the long (trouble free) ferry flight home from Goulburn to Mareeba.

The engine, a standard 100HP Rotax 912, has had an interesting upgrade; constant (always engaged) turbo-charging that brings maximum power output to 137HP. Nat needed the extra power and a larger diameter rotor in order to eventually fit a set of floats and use the aircraft as an amphibian.

A well constructed and cleverly designed Australian gyrocopter that will be of great interest to other gyro-copter pilots.

Exciting New Project for Atherton State High School Students

A partially constructed aircraft has been donated to the local chapter (Chapter 34) of the Sports Aircraft Association of Australia (SAAA). The members of this association have made this project available for construction by its members and also to the students of Atherton State High School. The aircraft is a Rand Robinson KR2S (pictured below is a completed sample); a two-seat aircraft made of wood, foam and fibreglass. It is a popular aircraft for the kit and homebuilder market worldwide.

The project will be an opportunity for the students to learn about the materials and tools used in building light aircraft, develop skills in using these materials and tools and also to be exposed to reading and understanding construction documents and plans. The students will be working on the aircraft under the strict supervision of qualified and/or experienced aircraft builders. The project is a long-term project and will allow the students to be a part of an exciting and unique experience and, ultimately, end with a flying aircraft! It is envisaged that this will be an extracurricular activity so will be run after school a few times a week. The project will be undertaken within Jon Collins' hangar at Atherton Aerodrome.

The long-term purpose of this project is to complete this current aircraft to a flying aircraft. The SAAA will then sell the aircraft in order to fund another kit aircraft so that future students can also benefit from this extraordinary opportunity.

The donation of the aircraft included many parts, however, tools, engine and aircraft instruments were not included. Chapter 34 of the SAAA is embarking on a campaign to ask for assistance in the form of donations of tools and funds. We hope that flyers and builders around the North Queensland area (and beyond!) might like to have a look at their tool stocks and see if they can donate any spare tools to the project. A list of possible tools required is shown next page. Or, if people like, they can make monetary donations to help this project get off the ground (literally!).







Well done Steve, what an amazing adventure!






NORTH QUEENSLAND AERO CLUB NEWS & EVENTS


