

## Donnington Airpark Trip June 2022 - By John Martin



The crew at Donnington Airpark, south of Townsville, have been upgrading the airfield, working hard and inviting aviators from everywhere to drop in and make use of the airfield. They now have a standing invitation for people to drop in on the final Sunday of each month. To that end they added an open weekend with catering and camping on the 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> of June.

They had two Tiger Moths from the Mackay Tiger Moth Museum as well as two Foxbats from the Mackay Flying School turn up giving joy flights and TIFs.

There was also a display from the local Willy's Jeep restoration club as well as a motor cycle restoration group and a vintage car club.

The catering was supplied by a local Camp Oven Catering group known as the Gidgee Gang who did a great job of a cooked three course dinner on Saturday and a hot breakfast on Sunday for a very reasonable price. Accommodation was camping under the wings.



Saturday morning in Atherton opened with low cloud. Although all the others who had planned to go bailed out, I figured I'd wait till it lifted, give it a go and if there was no easy, safe exit from the tablelands I'd turn around and come home.

Using my now go-to-App of Windy (which I can't praise enough) I essentially real timed the cloud, rain and radar and could see that via Gordonvale there was only a small patch of drizzle to go round and it was otherwise clear down the valley. After that I had a clear trip down the valley and over water from about Innisfail.

I passed through a very thin band of misty light rain at Ingham and emerged out from under the cloud to complete "8/8ths blue" just as shown on the real time satellite image on Windy. The trip through Townsville at 5500ft was this time unimpeded by ATC and approach to Donnington was easy.

The place was humming when I got there with Tiger Moths and Foxbats in the air and others loading pax on the ground.

The parking area was easy to find. Just park in the line of Jabirus!

Seems only Jabirus come there to camp!

Martin Boyle was already in Townsville visiting relatives and drove out to Donnington. So Cairns/Tableland was represented by the two of us showing the colours. The action was going all afternoon with the Tigers and the Foxbats doing a roaring trade. They had a number of stalls selling various craft and food items and a well received caravan selling burgers, drinks and snacks.

Then as they shut down for the day the mossies came out! Fortunately they only stayed for an hour or so and disappeared just as quickly.



The dinner was followed by a really interesting lecture by one of the longtime Tiger Moth pilots about the history of the two Tigers present, the Mackay Tiger Moth Museum, the design and development of the Tiger Moth and about Geoffrey de Havilland the designer. The lecture was extremely interesting and proved the highlight of the night with the yellow Tiger Moth pushed into the dining area and used as a backdrop for the talk.

There were probably a couple of hundred people at the weekend, all up. A constant small crowd was coming and going all day. There were far more people who drove and camped than flew and camped. But many of the driving campers were also pilots. Many were from farms and cattle stations around Charters Towers. A couple of pilots had flown from Longreach in their Jabiru.

The next day after breakfast I did a check of the weather and it was not good up the coast so I headed inland to Charters Towers for fuel, then north behind the cloud. Most of the trip was again in blue sky. The cloud to the east, while with a base of 5000 ft and only about 200 – 500 ft thick was solid and I dropped under cloud near Petford to get in. Getting back to Atherton was uneventful.






The airpark at Donnington is well worth the trip and a great place to stop in and camp. I reckon we need to encourage places like this.

#### PROJECT UPDATES

**C-47 Dakota Restoration**—Restoration of the main instrument panel continues. Its initial poor condition led to a decision to strip it back to bare timber and repaint which has revealed some damaged areas which have been fixed. The crew door hinges are being manufactured locally - unfortunately you can't just drop into your local hardware shop and buy a new set to replace the badly corroded hinge. The overhead instrument panels are in poor condition or non existent. Leo has reproduced the panel layouts on CAD and has had the panels laser cut and decals laser etched.

**C-47 Flight Simulator**—Leo, our Flight Simulator guru is building a DC3/C47 fixed flight simulator. We are utilising a former Air Niugini instrument panel to house the displays and instruments. The brains of the simulator – a high performance gaming computer will be required shortly to fire up the project! A used gaming computer or funding will be required.

**Winjeel Aircraft Syndicate**—Christian & Brendan have been investigating the acquisition of a former RAAF training aircraft with a radial engine. The aircraft is currently for sale and we are getting closer to forming a small syndicate of owners. This aircraft will be available to fly visitors on adventure flights and help raise funds for the museum. We're looking for one more person so if you are interested in helping make this project a reality please get in touch for more information.




