Visitors are most welcome.






BUILDERS CORNER - Extracts from Jon Collins' Skybolt Blog

Had a couple of drop-ins this morning, 2 aircraft from Toowoomba and another 2 Fox's came down from Atherton. Lloyd








The route flown by Kevin is shown as a series of green circles on the map above.


Numerous waterfalls along the way as we head out west

Out And About In The Far North - February Balloon Sunrise





JANUARY SAFETY CHAT

Precautionary Search and Runway Inspections It's the wet season and some of our local strips are getting a bit boggy. So it's time to think about when you last did a runway inspection. Precautionary Search is a standard part of everyone's PPL training but is one of those things that can be forgotten in routine flights and practice. So can you remember how to conduct a safe runway inspection? Can you remember the last time you practiced or had to conduct one on a wet and possibly boggy runway?

Planning your trip!

Planning you trip! Do you want to land on a grass or dirt runway in the wet season? You should always try to find out about the conditions before you head out! Your best step is to call the aerodrome operator, they should be able to tell you the most up to date information. You can then speak to one of our friendly instructing team for local advice. We keep our ears out for strip condition reports from local pilots across the wet season and can let you know the last report we received for your destination.



The Procedure

You have arrived overhead and you want to have a look at the strip before committing to a landing, this is a great idea! Remember always make your CTAF radio calls and fly the standard circuit pattern, a runway inspection is a safe procedure carried out to ensure a safe landing!

Step 1: Configure your aircraft. There is no point in rushing in to fly past the strip only to whip past so quickly you don't get a chance to actually inspect! A good configuration to set up on base or final is the slow speed straight and level configuration. For our 172's this is 2100 RPM, Carby Heat On, 10° of flap and trim it.

Step 2: Your height depends on the situation, always make a safe decision. Perhaps the visibility is good and you are happy with a 1000ft pass or perhaps the grass is long on the strip and you would like to descend to 500ft for a closer view. Remember to be aware of obstacles, wind direction, traffic, birds and be ready to performed a Go Around procedure if you need.

Step 3: The inspection. If you have your aircraft properly configured and trimmed for Straight and Level you will be able to focus on the inspection run. Ideally position the landing strip out your window so you can see exactly where you are planning on putting the wheels down. Now it's time for the WOSSSS checks. Wind, Obstacles, Size, Surface, Slope and Civilisation. You need to assess if this location is suitable for a safe landing.

Step 4: Decision time! Remember, you can make as many inspection passes as you would like, before you make your decision on whether to land or not.

If you think before you even depart that you are going to have to make an inspection run be certain you have planned with enough fuel to arrive at a safe alternate destination. And as always, if in doubt, or if in need of practice you can book in with one of our friendly instructors for a refresher!

FEBRUARY MUSEUM NEWSLETTER

This month fabrication is underway for our storage/restoration area roof and will be complete by the end of March. Containers (hangar walls) are being moved into place on Tuesday. In the coming weeks our efforts will be mainly focused on creating a functional storage/restoration area, putting the C-47 back on wheels, relocating fencing around our lease and submitting some crucial infrastructure grant applications.

RAAF re-establishes No. 100 Squadron

6 February 2021

The Hon Michael McCormack MP, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development. Ahead of centenary commemorations of the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF), No. 100 Squadron will be re-formed as the Air Force Heritage Squadron, operating from two locations RAAF Base Point Cook and Temora.

Minister for Defence Personnel Darren Chester said 100 Squadron had a proud history and after a 75-year absence it was fitting that RAAF reactivates it in the same year as it commemorates its first 100 years.

"First established during the Second World War in February 1942 at RAAF Base Richmond, 100 Squadron was an Air Force bomber and maritime patrol squadron, trained on Australian-built Bristol Beauforts," Mr Chester said. "The squadron conducted several successful missions throughout the war, taking part in the famous Battle of the Bismarck Sea in March 1943, and eventually disbanding in New Guinea on 19 August 1946".



Aerocommander Acquisition

The FNQAM board has agreed to acquire Aerocommander Shrike 500S, formerly registered as VH-UJE. The 1973 model aircraft type is well known to the north and was preferred for its high wing allowing uninterrupted visibility of the ground/water unlike most other twin engine aircraft. They were used extensively in Coastwatch, scenic & prawn spotting operations.

The aircraft comes with a fresh paint job but unfortunately has suffered corrosion to the wing spar rendering the aircraft unairworthy. It will require sheet metal work to re-join the wings and fabrication of engine cowls and other parts to turn return it to a complete aircraft.

Mid year it is expected the handover will occur relocating the aircraft from Cairns to Mareeba. Once restored will make a great gate guard, display or kids play-plane.

DC3/C47 Restoration Team Leader

We'll soon be sending out an expressions of interest for members and engineers to manage and assist the restoration of the C-47 to a presentable and safe standard. This position will lead other restoration volunteers, liaise with the board and suppliers as the aircraft is returned to its former RAAF glory.

The tailwheel leg and wheel rim has been welded up beautifully by Aerosmith Welding and is now awaiting reassembly and some fine weather. Thanks to Tableland Aircraft Maintenance for the use of their sand-blasting equipment and assisting with painting.


