
Three pointer, wheeler or tail down wheeler? There is no one-size-fits-all method. What works well on one *tailwheel* type might not be suitable on another or under different wind conditions. Anyway, even though I did not agree with all of the authors comments, they still gave me food for thought. There is much that the pilot of a *nose-wheel* aircraft can take away from the article.

So why am I writing this particular piece? Because nose-wheel aircraft continue to lose directional control, run off the side of runways and/or break off nose-wheels with a monotonous regularity. Soft and uneven landing surfaces can play a part in this type of accident however the main cause is incorrect technique during landing.

Not holding-off fully and allowing the aircraft to settle on all three wheels, or touching nosewheel first and/or releasing back elevator pressure after the wheels make contact with the ground can result in the transfer of excessive weight forward onto the nose-wheel. Any offcentre of the nose-wheel can then produce a sudden swing to one side causing the aircraft to "wheelbarrow" and the nose-wheel to "dig in".

How do we prevent this happening? The answer is quite simple:

- 1. Progressively apply elevator control back pressure until the aircraft stalls (hopefully just a few centimetres above the ground) and settles onto the runway in a nose high attitude and with the main-wheels touching first;
- 2. As the aircraft slows and elevator effectiveness is reduced, the nose-wheel will settle onto the runway. **DO NOT RELEASE THE ELEVATOR BACK PRESSURE** until the aircraft has decelerated to a **SLOW WALKING PACE**. This will keep most of the aircrafts weight on the main-wheels, less on the nose-wheel and improve directional stability.




Correct Touch-down Attitude

LANDING A TRICYCLE UNDERCARRIAGE (NOSEWHEEL) AIRCRAFT—Continued

A touch down at minimum speed and with a nose high attitude keeps stresses on the undercarriage to a minimum and, most importantly, helps straighten the aircraft if it is slightly missaligned with the runway on touch-down.



When touch-down is made on the main-wheels only, the aircrafts forward inertia (acting through the C of G in front of the main-wheels) and the rear-ward acting friction of the main-wheels combine to produce a straightening force.

Conversely, allowing excessive aircraft weight to act on the nose-wheel produces a destabilizing couple.

As with **tailwheel** aircraft, loss of directional control followed by a runway excursion often occurs later in the landing run when the pilot relaxes concentration and does not maintain the appropriate control inputs.

As the saying goes "the shows not over until the fat lady sings" or in our case "until the aircraft has slowed to a walking pace".

Try it, you might like it.

These days Alf's pride and joy is his SeaRae amphibian. Geoff Payne has an identical aircraft and there are two more in our area, one flying and one under construction












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NORTH QUEENSLAND AERO CLUB NEWS
