Passenger's Perspective of the Karumba Trip 13 – 14 June 2020

The patterns you can see from a small plane never cease to fascinate me



And the clouds always seem to grab the attention of the pilots (of course).

Saturday morning at the Aerodrome Cloud Atherton and light rain did not stop the bright yellow crop duster from buzzing around the Atherton fields but we hesitated until John and Yvonne Martin decided to have a looksee in their Jabiru DOD and found the blue sky over Mareeba which they had seen on the iPad.

Martin Boyle, Jabiru 1649, my brother, had offered the right hand seat and I was only too happy to accept as I love travelling in small planes. I walked away from my first solo but the plane (Cessna 152) didn't and I decided that being a passenger was much more fun. We flew into the blue sky, up to 8500 feet over a couple of cloud banks then landed in Normanton to refuel. I learned that you look at the pattern of the cloud shadows on the ground to judge the density of the clouds... something all you pilots knew of course.

A photo shot of Dorothy Prince's Purple Pub, Normanton, which is not purple from the air except for the shade cloth and then on to Karumba. Dorothy is my partner's sister so we just had to do the fly over.



Technology has advanced a lot since the early 2000s and it was interesting to see the pilots tracking each other on their iPads or not ... when technology was not functioning as desired. But good old fashioned radio talk kept us apart and safely back on the ground. Dave and Connie Graham and Dave Camp and his brother Mike raced through to Karumba in half the time and we were soon picked up by Julianne and driven to our motels. From the cool of the Atherton Tablelands to the 30C+ of Karumba two of the ladies decided they needed cooler footwear. Ash's had a range of bling thongs (jandals) but unfortunately they turned out to be the most crippling footwear we had tried in a long time giving blisters and cuts and were quickly abandoned except that John appeared to have a penchant for bright pink thongs with shiny black plastic jewels adorning the straps. Yes Jandals, from the 30+ years I spent in New Zealand. The word rolls off the tongue with more ease.

Well I learned a lot in Karumba over beers and mushy fish as the talk turned to autopilots and Dave's life threatening sail across the Tasman. I will never forget the tale of an 80 year old pilot setting his plane on autopilot then sleeping through Melbourne airspace, closing Melbourne airport, continuing beyond, and finally waking, realizing where he was, and taking his plane safely to the ground. That's how I remember the story, no need to correct me.

Karumba Trip—Continued


