The fabric covering of the elevator and rudder has been completed, the workmanship is very neat and should be very presentable when final paint has been applied. Covering of the wings and fuselage will be commenced once all smaller components are completed.

Layout of the instruments and panel has been finished and preparation of the wiring well underway.

A few **OPERATIONAL NOTES** for those flying in to YDOP.

RWY 11/29 is the ONLY operational strip. RWY 06/24 is NOT IN USE.

There is an area of unfinished earthworks on the RH side of RWY 11 - this is marked by orange cones and 2 unserviceability cones (red/white) along the side of the runway. DO NOT use this area. The runway itself is still usable there but it is not safe to deviate from the formed surface in this area.

Please DO NOT "shortcut" across the side of the runway to get to the parking area - there is a spoon drain on the outer edge of the runway and you risk doing a prop or worse if you hit it at speed or hit the wrong hollow!

Upon entering the taxiway, you can turn left or right to enter the designated aircraft parking areas. These are a hollow square outlined by white tyres on 3 sides, with no tyres along the taxiway (an open entrance both sides). The left hand one runs along the front of the windsock and weather station, the right hand one in front of the Social Centre hangar.

There is also an orange mesh fence supported by star-steel pickets, separating the RH aircraft parking area from the public area along the same orientation as the Social Centre hangar. This mesh fence runs outside the white tyres (further away from aircraft) on that side.


All in all, it is a quite straightforward arrangement and should be readily recognizable once you arrive overhead and on the ground. Please try to park in an orderly fashion so that all aircraft can be accommodated but remember to leave room for others to manoeuvre and exit.






